Kees de Bever was born in Vught, as son of a carpenter. He studied at the Royal School of 's-Hertogenbosch and then worked at the architectural firm of WG Welsing in Arnhem and from 1912 at the office 'van Kooiken' in Eindhoven. In 1929 he married the daughter of Louis van Kooiken and in 1933 he got the full management of Kooiken & de Bever. After the death of Louis, the agency bore only the name of De Bever.

His work continues on the lines of his father-in-law. It includes designs for churches, monasteries, schools, shops, offices and homes. As an architect, he developed a traditionalist way of building, mainly with bricks, as in the house at the Paradijslaan in the center of Eindhoven. In this green area and located on the waterfront the yellow brick fits well with nature. The building shows a well measured and precise design, the building can be defined as 'Delftse School'.
